COVID-19 INFORMATION - April 18th:

The number of Utahns infected with COVID 19 continues to grow, as does the social and economic impact resulting from necessary actions to control the spread of the disease. This is an update on COVID-19 state and county public health directives and orders. Emigration Metro Township Council urges all residents of Emigration to follow these orders and guidelines as completely as possible. We are also providing information on assistance available for small business owners.

STATE:

The State of Utah Public Health Order prohibiting gatherings of more than 10 people remains in place until May 1st.

Governor Herbert has extended the statewide “Stay Safe, Stay Home” directive to May 1st. The directive has been expanded, asking all individuals to wear a mask when in public, particularly when entering indoor spaces.

Additionally, Governor Herbert announced that all public schools will remain in a “soft closure” through the end of the 2019/2020 school year. Soft closure means that distance learning (online) and school meal programs continue.

SALT LAKE COUNTY:

On April 10th, Mayor Jenny Wilson and the Salt Lake County Public Health Department extended the “Stay Safe, Stay Home” order through May 1st, 2020. The order was revised on Friday, April 17th, and the “stay home” portion of the order has been rescinded, to make it easier for residents to travel outside their homes. Most other sections of the April 10th order remain in effect. Salt Lake County has also requested that all people wear masks in public places.
